Ahrend is the founder of The Traveling Team, a collegiate mobilization ministry, and for seven years he and his wife, Jessica, have traveled the United States speaking to college students about missions. They have been on more than 450 college campuses and have spoken to thousands of students trying to help them understand their role in world evangelization.

Todd is a graduate of Northeastern State University and a former campus minister at Tulsa University. He has a master's degree from Dallas Theological Seminary and a Doctorate from Gordon-Conwell Theological Seminary.

Todd and Jessica have been married for 13 years and have three children, Camden, Brody, and Axel.

Ledoux currently serves as the International Disaster Response and Preparedness Manager at Samaritan's Purse International Relief in Boone, N.C. Prior to her time at Samaritan's Purse International Headquarters, Betsy spent three years overseas with Samaritan's Purse where she served as the Deputy Country Director in Mozambique for two years. As the Deputy Country Director in Haiti for more than a year—immediately following the 2010 earthquake and through the cholera epidemic—she co-led a team of up to 1,100 people in disaster response.

After graduating from Asbury University and then Auburn University with her Master of Public Administration degree in 2004, Betsy moved to Washington, D.C. as a Presidential Management Fellow.

Betsy is married to Nick Ledoux, who also serves with Samaritan's Purse. They currently live in Boone.
