Nine Questions for Basic Character/Scene Analysis

- 1. Who am I? (See bio questions below)
- 2. Where am I?
- 3. What surrounds me?
- 4. What is my relationship to the person I'm talking to?
- **5. What are the given circumstances?** (given circumstances are anything that affects your scene)

That can be the weather, health, your phone is dinging from texts coming in, you're hungry, you have 5 min to have this conversation before you have to go.

- 6. VERY IMPORTANT: What do I want in response back from the person I am talking to?
- 7. What will happen if I get the response I want?
- 8. What's in my way of getting it?
- 9. What do I do to get what I want?
