Asbury University is privileged to honor a select few alumni who exemplify academic excellence and spiritual vitality. While many could receive this recognition, our 2021 Award Recipients are celebrated below and will be recognized at the University Update, Saturday morning.



A AWARD RECIPIENTS

Drs. Gilbert '60 and Janice Shaw '61 Crouse

Gil, former senior economist with Health and Human Services, and Janice, former senior fellow at the Beverly LaHaye Institute, have been in the advocacy business since early in their careers. Both have been awarded and recognized, nationally and internationally, for their leadership and service. In the 1970's, Gil was instrumental in establishing and starting the business department at Asbury with then colleague Don Winslow. After that time, Gil spent 25-plus years with HHS helping to administer programs that dealt with health, welfare and health information technology. He conducted and presented research on the impact of opioids and substance abuse on the child welfare system, which caused an increase in the number of children at risk and in foster care. His advocacy for this vulnerable population provided a call to action on a nation-wide level. Janice, former Asbury Board of Trustees member, has been named "Woman of the Year" three times, the last time by the World Congress of Families in 2013, for her work on national and international issues regarding sexual trafficking, abuse of women, human rights and religious freedom. Twice she has served the President as an official delegate to the United Nations (2002 and 2003). As an author, professor, academic dean, speaker and speechwriter for former President George H.W. Bush, Janice has spent a lifetime advocating for others.

We are grateful for the lifetime of service these two have provided to our nation and the worldwide community.

Dr. Jeannine Brabon '71

There are and will be thousands of people in Heaven because of Jeannine's work on behalf of our Lord and Savior. A One Missions Society (OMS) missionary, Jeannine continues to put Jesus first in all she does. After graduation, she was a missionary in Spain for 16 years and then returned to Colombia where she grew up. While in Colombia, she began an exciting but dangerous prison ministry in Medellin's maximum-security prison. In 1992, she began the Bellavista Prison Bible Institute, graduating prisoners who now minister to other inmates across the nation. Due to her prison ministry, she has been dubbed the "Angel of Bellavista." She taught biblical Hebrew and has been involved in evangelism, discipleship and training church leaders. She continues to speak and train, sharing in our own Chapel services multiple times. In 2001, Jeannine received an honorary doctor of Christian ministries degree from Asbury University. In 2009, she received the World Methodist Council Peace Award. Her work is not finished, as she continues to faithfully serve the Lord, sharing the good news of the Gospel with all she comes into contact. This fearlessness and faithfulness to God has been a hallmark of her life from a very early age.

Jeannine's prayers have literally changed and impacted the world, beginning with our own revival in 1970.

Dr. Janine (Jeannie) Corbitt '76 Jones

Growing up on the mission field, with a father in charge of medical missions and a mother who practiced medicine into her late 80s, Jeannie knew she had big shoes to fill. As a campus physician at the University of Kentucky, Jeannie has cared for students for more than 30 years. Before that, she worked at a mission hospital in Hualian, Taiwan with her husband, Raleigh (also a physician), and in urgent care medicine. The care she provides includes more than diagnosing a physical ailment. Jeannie cares for the whole person—mind, body and soul as she learned from her family and her experience at Asbury. Her ministry is one of service that includes generosity, a listening ear, a willingness to speak truth in hard situations and a deep love for the students who cross her path. She believes the Lord has placed her where she is for a purpose. This care and concern follow her into all of her circles of influence. Jeannie has served on the Alumni Board and as the Board of Trustees alumni representative. She has been on countless focus groups and think tanks for the University, such as the Ignited Campaign, Presidential Search Committee and served as the Reunion Class Gift Chair. More than that, Jeannie graciously cares for our alumni during our Reunion weekends if there is a medical need. We are thankful for her generosity, intentionality, and hospitality as she serves.

A little touch of wilderness close to home, you can expect to see waterfowl, beaver, trout and other aquatic wildlife on the trip. Trip leaders are certified Wilderness First Responders and have canoe instruction and field experience in a variety of wilderness programming. Appropriate clothing includes athletic shoes, shorts, t-shirt and swimsuit (if you would like to swim). Please also bring a towel.

In the case we encounter bad weather, back-up plans have been made with the Adventure Leadership Group. Either way, the drop off and pick up locations will remain the same.





DIRECTIONS TO OFF-CAMPUS EVENTS

Asbury Theological Seminary Student Center (Cafeteria)

Walking:

From the Semi circle, walk straight across the street, where you see the statue of Charles Wesley. then walk down the staircase behind him between Estes Chapel and the Library. Following that sidewalk/pavement, keep walking straight and you will see the Seminary's Student Center on your right. Walk in the glass doors and the cafeteria will be on your right.

Driving:

Driving out of the semicircle, take a right onto the main road (N. Lexington Ave) and turn left at the light onto E. Main Street. Barely having passed the church (it will be on your left) turn left before you pass Solomon's Porch into a parking area; keep going to the end of the parking area staying to your left.

Once you are parked, go to the Student Center and the cafeteria will be on your right once you enter the glass doors.

As a reference point to find the Student Center: once you have parked and step onto the sidewalk on the edge of the seminary campus, look for the water fountain, it is a center piece in the center of the buildings. When you are facing the fountain, with the parking lot behind you, the Student Center will be the first building on your right.

Bethel Pointe Club House

100 Academy Drive, Wilmore

From Asbury's semicircle, turn Right onto N. Lexington Ave. Turn Left at the traffic light onto E. Main St. In 0.3 miles, turn Right onto Rice St. before the railroad tracks. Bear to the Right onto Walters Ln. Turn Left onto Academy Dr. into Bethel Pointe. The Club House will be straight in front of you at the end of the road. Parking is located on either side of the Club House.

Equine Center

From Asbury's semicircle, turn Right onto N. Lexington Ave. heading south toward High Bridge. Continue straight through the caution light and stop sign at Lowry Lane. Turn Right on Shanty Hill Lane (0.8 miles from the semicircle and an AU directional sign will be on the left side of the road). In approximately 0.5 miles at a sharp turn in the road, you will see an Asbury sign. Turn Right onto the gravel driveway. The University's hiking trails and ropes course will be on your left. Continue on the gravel road which dead ends at the Equine Center.

WARNING: Shanty Hill Lane is an extremely narrow two-lane road. Please use caution.
