Steps to export H.264 .mp4 file from Adobe Premiere Pro CC:

1. From the File Menu, choose "Export", "Media..."
2. In the "Format" dropdown menu choose "H.264"
3. In the "Preset" dropdown menu choose "High Quality 1080p HD"
4. Scroll down to confirm the following settings:

Steps to upload your film to Google Drive and share a link on the online submission form:

1. Export your film via the specifications given above.
2. Login to or create a free Google account and access Google Drive: <https://www.google.com/drive/>
3. Locate and click the button, **Go to Drive**. Be sure to have at least 2GB of free space.
4. Locate the exported file that you made of your film. **Be sure your film is named with your first and last name followed by the title as shown in this example "FirstLastTitle.mp4"**.
5. Drag the file onto the Google Drive page and it will begin uploading.
6. When the file has uploaded, **do these two very important steps:**
 - Right click on your file, select **Share**, then select **Share**. In the box titled **Add people, groups, and calendar events**, type hbffhighschoolsubmissions@gmail.com. Press Enter. Be sure **Editor** is selected in the box at the right. Click **Send**.
 - Right click on your file, select **Share**, then select **Share**. This time in the General access section, verify that **Anyone with the link** and **Editor** are selected. Then click **Copy link** in the lower left. Paste this link on your submission form where requested.

Note: **Do not delete** your film from your Google Drive account until after the festival. The shared file will be processed by the Highbridge Team and must remain on your Google Drive. You may now log out of your Google Drive and continue completing the submission form.
