



A AWARD RECIPIENTS

Dr. Kay Fuller '57 Rader

"You can't do that; you're a girl." Thankfully, Dr. Kay Fuller '57 Rader never heard this advice as a child. Her family believed that women and men are called by God into ministry as equals. This belief undergirded her lifetime of learning and service within the ministry of The Salvation Army. Commissioner Dr. Kay F. Rader is a retired Salvation Army officer, having served the latter part of her active officer-ship as the World President of Women's Organizations for The Salvation Army International. She and her husband, Dr. Paul A. Rader '56 (General and former leader of The Salvation Army, and former President of Asbury University), served in Korea for more than 20 years before accepting an international leadership role. Their ministry rippled out across the globe. After their retirement, she joined her husband as he stepped into leadership at Asbury University. Kay continued to model God's call as she encouraged, challenged and inspired students at Asbury to courageously trust God and to follow His leading. She has served on numerous boards, including those at Roberts Wesleyan College and Asbury Theological Seminary. She received honorary degrees from both institutions, as well as from Greenville College. She has faithfully and fully followed her Savior all around the world. This faithfulness opened a door for many to come into fellowship with Christ. The journey with Paul has brought them into a better understanding of how God leads fully surrendered people

to bring forth great accomplishments for the Kingdom. The Raders have three children: Edie Moon (Jack '73), Jennifer Purvis '87 (Ray) and James Paul (J.P.) '83 (Helen Rehner '80), seven grandchildren plus spouses and seven great-grandchildren.

Dr. Jonathan '67 and Judith Hoover '67 Culver

For most of his missionary career, Dr. Jonathan Culver has focused on a Christian theology of Ishmael as a foundation for mission engagement with Muslims. Throughout Jonathan and Judith's 37 years as missionaries in Indonesia and Malaysia, they have used teaching, mentoring and the authorship of books and articles to challenge students in theological schools and mission training programs to engage with Muslims. Jonathan also served as a theological consultant for both an Indonesian and a Malaysian Bible translation for Muslims readers. Judith focused on prayer and healing ministry with expatriate and national women. Both Jonathan and Judith continue to serve part-time with their mission board, One Challenge International based in Colorado Springs, Colorado. Currently, they reside in Nicholasville, Kentucky, and are members of the Church of the Savior. They are also the proud parents of two sons, Joshua who lives with his family in Duarte, California, and Jesse who lives with his family in Navarre, Florida. The Culvers come from a long line of servant-leaders, including former A-Award recipients Dr. Maurice Culver '39, Dr. Ellsworth Culver '47 and Rev. Shirley Culver '67 DeWolf.

Andy '96 and Andrea Toledo '97 Baker

Since 2001, Andy '96 and Andrea Toledo '97 Baker have served within the country of Bolivia with Word Made Flesh Bolivia. In 1994, when Andrea made her first trip to Bolivia with WGM, she discovered her passion for missions and the people of Bolivia. Andy and Andrea then co-founded a work together, and Andrea now serves as Executive Director. Andy serves as the Global Strategy Director for Rescue: Freedom International. They have spent their life serving the vulnerable and marginalized, especially women and children who are sexually exploited. Every day at least 40 million people are trafficked around the world. Andy works to empower a global network of partners who are fighting human trafficking worldwide. Andrea works on the ground on behalf of local prostituted women and their children to provide hospitality, healing, discipleship, tutoring, skills training and alternative employment. During their time in Bolivia, they founded SutiSana as part of this ministry. They minister to these individuals through outreach, care, advocacy and opportunities. Their efforts have encouraged and reached thousands of women and children to seek an abundant life with Christ and His goodness. Their goal is to see others live in full freedom from slavery, in all contexts. The Bakers have four boys: Eli '25, Luke, Asher and Owen.

YOUNG ALUMNI AWARD

Stockton Brown '12

Stockton Brown '12 is currently a volunteer with International Justice Mission (IJM) as a legal counsel in human trafficking for Ghana. Along with this work, she serves with Ghana Survivors Network to begin the support process for those who have been saved from human trafficking. Stockton sees her work as being a gracious advocate for those who do not possess the ability to speak for themselves. Her work in the field of law provides a daily opportunity to seek justice, love mercy, and walk humbly with God (Micah 6:8). The integration of her faith and the law happens in ordinary moments, and she hopes to use her work daily to make a connection back to God. Before this service in Ghana, she earned her law degree from Regent University and clerked for a Federal District Court Judge in North Carolina.

VOLUNTEERS OF THE YEAR

Derek Motsch '02

Derek Motsch '02 graduated from Asbury with a degree in Physical Science in 2002. He is a senior civil engineer at Element Design in Lexington, Kentucky, a company that offers design services for landscape architecture, civil engineering, planning and drone mapping. Derek volunteered his time and talents to create architectural renderings for a Garden Plaza at the Kirkland Complex, which is the 2022 Reunion Gift Project. The stunning images Derek created brought the concepts for the Garden Plaza to life. His contribution to the vision of a beautiful, multi-use space that builds community through athletics, events, study and reflection has galvanized fundraising for the project. It also illustrates Derek's commitment to an integration of life and faith and a desire to impact culture for Christ through his profession, his skills and his servant life. Derek and his wife Billie Rice '02 Motsch live in Lexington with their children.

Chuck and Kathy Bowdoin '11 Christensen

Chuck Christensen is a superintendent with Moss and Associates, a national construction company that specializes in construction management, general contracting, design-build and public-private partnerships. Chuck's keen interest in athletics led to his using his expertise in these areas to provide invaluable advice and assistance on such Asbury projects as the Kirkland Complex, the Bowdoin Athletic Practice Facility and the Softball Press Box. He often serves as a liaison, providing direction and connection between the University and the building industry professionals involved with on-campus construction. 

