## A AWARD RECIPIENTS

### Rev. Kathleen Register '53 Redeker

A faithful follower of God and a lover of all others that He places within her path is one way to describe Rev. Kathleen Register '53 Redeker. She was involved in education and then full-time ministry, serving in Japan and North Carolina until her retirement. As a pastor, she was a caring and compassionate teacher who modeled the call of God to live a life of "holiness unto the Lord." She served her alma mater faithfully from 1990-1993 as an Alumni Board member and continues to serve Asbury, using every opportunity to tell others about the University, making the most of each encounter. She and her late husband, Immo, established a family scholarship to help students attend Asbury and discover God's call on their lives. Kathleen is intentionally present in the lives of some of our current students, providing both spiritual and financial support. A fervent prayer warrior, she carries Asbury and her family to the feet of Jesus daily. She rarely misses a Chapel service online and is one of Asbury's greatest fans on social media. In her own quiet and faith-filled way, Kathleen has impacted countless people, helping them find God's best for their lives.

### Arvid '73 and Judy Mommsen '65 Metcalf

Exemplifying servant-leadership and devotion to Christ, Arvid '73 and Judy Mommsen '65 Metcalf invest in their community in big and small ways. From opening their doors to fellow classmates for gatherings and weekly Bible

studies; to hosting and helping local families; to leading the local Friendship International group; to providing food and flowers for the community; this couple is deeply rooted in service. They genuinely believe in loving others more than they do themselves, modeling this through their actions and words. "When I think of the Metcalfs, I think of Priscilla and Aquila in the New Testament. Their home was always open, and their gifts of hospitality touched so many, both neighbors and internationals. The fact that the Metcalf house is the first house you see driving into Wilmore is symbolic of the gracious welcome God gives to all. And what they do, they always do as a couple. Their ministry is one of a united team," said Katy Kinlaw '75 Key.

### Rev. Dr. Chris Bounds '88

As an ambassador for God's Kingdom and the Wesleyan Holiness doctrine, Rev. Dr. Chris Bounds '88 advances the cause of Christ around the world through his teaching, preaching and writings. He has served as a pastor in the United Methodist Church, as a professor and as the Wesley Scholar in residence at Asbury. Currently, he is the Dean of the School of Theology and Ministry at Indiana Wesleyan University and the Chairman of the Board for the Francis Asbury Society. A theologian who is committed to communicating Wesleyan distinctives, his desire is to see people respond to the invitation to live a saved, sanctified and sent life for God. He lives in quick obedience to do

whatever the Lord asks of him. When not teaching in the classroom, he is preaching at camp meetings, speaking at retreats (like our Set Apart Retreat), authoring books, and inquisitively seeking more of God.

## YOUNG ALUMNI AWARD

### Elijah Friedeman '15

A young alum who has utilized his majors in Ancient Languages and Communications to undergird his ministry in establishing the Foundry Church in Mississippi, Elijah Friedeman '15 is not afraid to place his trust in Jesus. She was also seen at the Outpouring, day after day, taking out trash, greeting people, serving snacks, and filling in gaps as needed. What goes unseen are the many daily prayers she offers on behalf of Dr. Brown, his leadership team, the Asbury family and for students who have attended the Set Apart Retreats. Her faithfulness to the call of Kingdom purpose and service is a legacy she embraces wholeheartedly and demonstrates with joy and generosity.
