A Story of Restoration

I accepted Jesus into my heart when I was young, and I believed that He was my Savior, but He was not the king I answered to. I let anxiety, the need for perfection, and worry rule my life.

I knew that God's Word said that He loved me fiercely, but I did not understand how He possibly could, given everything I had done to dishonor Him. In October 2024, I went on a Set Apart Retreat. I was extremely anxious, and I hated the ocean. I tried to walk into the retreat expectant, but I was mostly full of shame and guilt. When we arrived, Jeannie Banter '06, the director, encouraged us to make room for God to do whatever He wanted to with our lives.

A student leader shared from Psalm 51, and it resonated with me. He asked, "Do you still have the joy of your salvation?" I realized how much space in my heart anxiety and shame had taken up, leaving no room for joy or peace.

One of our speakers shared Genesis 1:2, where we find the all-powerful God of the universe hovering over the formless, void, and dark places. We were reminded that we can take comfort in the fact that He is not afraid of hovering over these places within us. I listened to God in that moment, and He said, "Abbie, surrender your anxiety and shame to me."


I felt emptied of the shame I had been carrying for so long, and I invited His joy and peace inside instead. This feeling was unlike anything I had ever experienced in my life. I just could not stop smiling. I was filled with such joy and freedom that I couldn't keep it inside.

I still have days when I may feel anxious. However, in those moments I am reminded of the faithfulness of God to deliver me from anxiety and fill me with joy, even in the midst of difficulties. In 1 Peter 5:10, Peter prays for the persecuted Church: "After you have suffered for a little while, the God of all grace, who called you to His eternal glory in Christ, will Himself perfect, confirm, strengthen, and establish you." Please remember that God loves each and every one of you, and there is absolutely NO limit to the amount of brokenness that He can redeem in your life.
