

A AWARD RECIPIENTS

Howard Biddulph '65

As class president of the Class of 1965, Howard Biddulph's leadership and love for the Asbury community were evident even in his student days. In the years since, he has remained a steadfast ambassador for his alma mater—attending Reunions and regional events, mentoring students, and praying faithfully for the University and our students.

A career missionary, Howard, with wife Jan Fraser '64 Biddulph who received the A-Award in 1994, spent more than 30 years ministering in Colombia. This ministry started in university work, morphing into a house church and then moving to a larger location, generating three daughter congregations. Howard later served in pastoral ministry in Fort Myers, Florida, and continues today as a mentor to missionaries in residence at Asbury Theological Seminary. His dedication to alumni prayer gatherings and his willingness to serve during the Outpouring of 2023 as a volunteer speaks to his enduring devotion to the spiritual life of our community.

Inspired by the spiritual mentoring he received as a student, Howard has devoted his life to shepherding others. His life and ministry reflect the heart of Asbury—committed to Christ, to calling, and to building up the Body of believers around the world. Howard and Jan continue the legacy of Asburians with their family, including grandchildren.

Steve Seamands '70

Dr. Steve Seamands '70 is professor of Christian Doctrine at Asbury Theological Seminary, where he has served since 1983. He is also the author of several books including: *Ministry in the Image of God: The Trinitarian Shape of Christian Service*, and *Give Them Christ: Preaching His Incarnation, Crucifixion, Resurrection, Ascension and Return*.

Steve's ministry is defined by fervent prayer and his heart for authentic worship. He is dedicated to equipping and edifying the body of Christ and frequently leads retreats and seminars on issues such as emotional healing and spiritual renewal. A thoroughly trinitarian outlook provides the framework for his ministry "of Jesus Christ, to the Father, through the Holy Spirit, on behalf of the church and the world." He is a pastor's pastor, providing wisdom and guidance to those who shepherd congregations, pursue missions, or disciple others.

Whether preaching in Asbury University's chapel services, mentoring students during the 2023 Outpouring, or speaking at New Room and Awakening Project events, Steve's impact is lasting and Spirit-led. As a member of the Valiant Class of 1970, he remains a faithful supporter of the Asbury community. He believes that students come here not only to be trained—but to be mended. And through his pastoral heart and theological knowledge, he has helped countless men and women be restored for effective ministry in the church and to the world.

Patti Snelling '75 Howard

Patti Snelling '75 Howard embraced the commitment of academic excellence and spiritual vitality. For 35 years, the Clark County, Indiana public school system was her mission field. A multi-sport athlete, Patti coached basketball, golf and track, using athletics as a platform for ministry. When a colleague introduced her to the Fellowship of Christian Athletes, Patti discovered an invaluable discipleship opportunity. She opened a chapter with a gathering of three people one rainy morning, and just a year later, 120 high school students belonged to that Huddle.

Her legacy of faith and leadership is evident through the lives of her former students, who serve God in the communities in which they live and work. This includes her son, Zach, who followed in her footsteps to become a physical education teacher, coach and Huddle leader. In 2022, FCA, the world's largest international sports ministry, inducted Patti into its Hall of Champions.

Now a successful realtor, Patti supports Asbury University through faithful stewardship of her generosity, time, and attendance at alumni events. She embodies a life fully surrendered to Christ; one marked by joy and a deep desire to make Jesus known. She continues to live out her calling with kindness, humility, and purpose.

YOUNG ALUMNI AWARD

Will '10 and Laura Perry '10 Sallee

The ministry of Will Sallee III '10 and Laura Perry '10 Sallee reflects a deep commitment to sharing the love of Christ across cultures and generations. As missionaries with TMS Global, they actively serve Christ through their ministry in Antequera, Spain. Their work demonstrates a deep commitment to sharing the gospel with young adults and immigrants in a culture that doesn't emphasize a personal relationship with Jesus. TMS Global equips them to lead disciple-making efforts among young people and immigrant communities. The organization also supports their family life by offering strong member care, which helps them thrive as they raise their two young sons while serving overseas.

In Antequera, they have established a non-profit called "Meeting Point," where they represent Jesus to a largely unchurched population and empower the next generation in Spain and

Europe to boldly follow Christ and discover their identity and calling. Through Bible studies, community youth events, coaching in a volleyball league, and serving the local church, they form relationships with young adults and help them explore what it means to follow Christ.

Will and Laura continue to support Asbury through participation in Reunions (including swim team reunions), hosting Asburians in their home, and coordinating an annual gathering of AU mentors, friends and donors. Their commitment to cultivating vibrant Christian community while discipling the next generation reflects Asbury's dedication to spiritual vitality. Will and Laura exemplify the call to love God and serve others. Their faithful witness is a testament of young alumni using every part of life to build the Kingdom.





