Psychology is the study of mental life and behavior. At Asbury, the student explores the various aspects of psychological study (biological, cognitive, developmental, social/personality, and mental and physical health) from a distinctly orthodox Christian perspective. Asbury's psychology program offers several concentrations for psychology majors to pursue if so desired. They include biological psychology, business psychology, child psychology, Christian counseling, clinical/counseling psychology, equine assisted mental health, forensic psychology, social psychology, and student development psychology. Interested psychology majors, in consultation with their academic advisor, can use the psychology electives to tailor their undergraduate major toward any of these specific areas of study.

Students must complete all Foundations requirements and major requirements, as well as any additional General Electives needed to reach the minimum of 124 total credits required for a Bachelor's degree.
