Students majoring in Spanish study one of the major languages of the world, ranking fifth in the number of native speakers. Spanish is the most frequently studied foreign language. The major focuses primarily on the language, culture and literature of Spanish-speaking countries found in South America and Spain. In addition, a student may also attain a teaching certificate (P-12) in Spanish.

Students must complete all Foundations requirements and major requirements, as well as any additional General Electives needed to reach the minimum of 124 total credits required for a Bachelor's degree.
