Residential Students Arrive for Move-In — Residence Halls*

During your assigned arrival time, follow the signs directing you to the unloading zone for your residence hall and receive further instructions. Student leaders and campus community will assist with move-in.

***NOTE: If you have not submitted all required health documents AND completed Financial Registration by 4 p.m. on Wednesday, August 19, you will FIRST need to go directly to Kinlaw Library at your "Arrive for Move-In" time. (Park in the Kinlaw Lot--"P1" on the [campus map](#)). AFTER completing these items (including your full Semester Check-In if you did NOT attend an Eagle Day) and receiving clearance, you will be able to enter the move-in line at your residence hall.**
